



FVHS Dress Code Policy

Dear Fuquay High School Students and Parents:

Welcome to Fuquay-Varina High School for the 2009-2010 school year! As we close on our summer vacation, I would like to take this opportunity to remind students and parents of the dress code policy (Policy 6410.1 – Inappropriate Dress) for Fuquay-Varina High School and the Wake County Public School System. It is critically important to remember as students and parents that WCPSS and FVHS have well-defined expectations for proper school attire. The following items listed below are some of the most common violations of the dress code policy:

- Exposed undergarments
- Attire that exposes cleavage/muscle shirts
- Bare midriff shirts
- Backless/halter tops and net shirts
- Excessively tight or short garments
- Sagging pants
- Accessory items such as belt buckles, chains, or belts with spikes, that could be perceived as dangerous or used as a weapon
- Shirts/tops with spaghetti straps
- Shirts with open sides including tank tops
- Skirts and shorts not at mid thigh length (should be four finger length from kneecap)
- Hats or headgear of any kind (This applies to males and females.) Hats must be put away as soon as the morning bell rings and there should be no reason to walk around carrying your hat all day.
- Pajamas

Fuquay-Varina High School faculty and staff will be enforcing the dress code policy from the first day of school. Students are expected to comply with the dress code policy everyday of the school year. Students who are in violation of the dress code policy will be subject to consequences from school administration. I would strongly encourage you to review and reiterate the dress code policies found in the FVHS and Wake County Student Handbooks with your child prior to the start of school. Remember - When in doubt, do not wear it!
